Andrew (known to many of his friends as Andy) went missing while walking alone from the head of Glen Nevis over the weekend of 28/29 January 2006. Despite an extensive 3 day search by local mountain rescue teams, RAF search and rescue teams plus helicopters and SARDA dog teams, he was never found and has been officially declared deceased.

After graduating from Hull University in 1993, Andrew subsequently joined the army and passed out from the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst in 1997, being commissioned into the Royal Artillery where he attained the rank of Major at age 32 and won his much coveted commando green beret. He was a true professional and died enjoying his passion of hillwalking and photography, for which he had developed a particular talent. At the time of his death Andrew was 33 with a very bright future ahead of him and is sadly missed by his family and many friends and colleagues.
